Top News Stories

- Gerald Ford formally announces his candidacy for the 1976 presidential election.
- Gerald R. Ford escaped an assassination attempt on September 5th 1975, in Sacramento, California by Lynette Alice (Squeaky) Fromme, who pointed, but did not fire, a .45-caliber pistol. He also escaped another assassination attempt in San Francisco, California on September 22, 1975 by Sara Jane Moore, who fired one shot from a .38-caliber pistol that was deflected.
- Former President of the Teamsters, Jimmy Hoffa, is reported missing in Detroit – FBI opens investigation.
- Six member unions of the AFL-CIO announce a boycott on loading of grain bound for the U.S.S.R.
- U.S. Viking unmanned spacecraft sets off on a 500-million-mile journey to Mars to seek signs of life.
- U.S. Apollo and Soviet Soyuz 19 spacecrafts link up 140 miles above earth; American astronauts Brig. General Thomas P. Stafford, Donald K. Slayton, and Vance D. Brand shake hands and share meals with Soviet cosmonauts Col. Aleksei Leonov and Valery N. Kubasov; the first international manned space flight.
- Patricia Hearst, missing since Feb 7, 1974, is caught by the F.B.I. in San Francisco; caught with William and Emily Harris, remnants of the Symbionese Liberation Army, who kidnapped Miss Hearst.
- The U.S. marks the start of the American Revolution Bicentennial with ceremonies at the Old North Church in Boston.
- Margaret Thatcher becomes leader of the British Conservative Party, succeeding Edward Heath.

Semiconductors

- 4 inch wafers were introduced, but most fabs were still running 2 or 3 inch.
- A state-of-the-art chip has less than 10,000 transistors on it.
- Most fabs were using K&S 636 & Kasper aligners.
- A 5-wafer tray system for spinning and developing was popular.
- Silicon Valley, (a fairly new term at the time) had about 63 companies producing semiconductors.
- Projection aligners were gaining popularity but most engineers were still smashing the mask into the wafer.
- LPCVD nitride systems were becoming trendy.
- Barrel reactors for stripping photo resist and etching nitride were fairly popular.
- Selective oxidation was referred to informally as the "Isoplanar Process" no matter what the official position might have been.
- Most Silicon Valley process engineers not working for Fairchild had pirated copies of the so-called "Fairchild Curves".
